Melbourne Resident Earns Aircraft Association Scholarship for Florida Tech

MELBOURNE, FLA.—Jason Liu, a Florida Tech junior majoring in aviation management, was awarded a \$4,200 Corporate Aviation Business Scholarship from the National Aircraft Finance Association (NAFA). Liu is a 2006 graduate of Satellite High School.

The NAFA scholarship was established to benefit students who are pursuing a management-oriented career in corporate aviation, specifically within the corporate aircraft finance industry.

Liu, on the Florida Tech Deans List since he came to the university, was one of only three students from across the nation to receive this inaugural scholarship award. Recipients were chosen by NAFA board members based on various criteria, including course of study and academic performance.

The National Aircraft Finance Association is a non-profit corporation. It is dedicated to promote the general welfare of individuals and organizations providing aircraft financing and loans secured by aircraft, to improve the industry's service to the public and to work with government agencies to foster a greater understanding of members' needs.
